Documents

The following must be shown at registration and must be valid on the day of the event.

1. Provincial, or equivalent, driver's licence for any crew member listed as driver.
2. Vehicle registration.
3. Third party liability insurance covering the entered vehicle.
4. Written permission from a parent or guardian for participation in the rally for persons under the age of 19.
5. Valid first aid certificate for CARS licensed competitors.
6. A minimum of a CARS regional rally licence for both crew members.
7. Residents of the USA who do not hold a CARS licence may compete with an SCCA ClubRally licence or better.
8. Competitors resident outside Canada, who do not hold valid licences may enter or participate if they hold an FIA international rally licence.

Vehicle Eligibility

All vehicles must comply with the 2001 CARS Rally Regulations.

US Vehicles – Under CARS rules, vehicles registered in any of the United States of America shall be acceptable provided that they meet the requirements of the current SCCA Rally Rules. Entrants whose cars are entered under this provision must be able to produce, upon request by the officials of the event, a copy of the SCCA Pro Rally Rules. Failure to produce these may result in the vehicle being judged according to CARS rules.

Crew Eligibility

At least one member of the first placed crews in each of the following classes: Overall, Production Over (P4 & N4 combined), Production Under (P1-3 and N1-3 combined), Group 2 and Open, must be present for the scheduled awards presentation. Failure to do so will result in forfeiture of all awards and trophies won by that crew.

Vehicle Identification

Door numbers will be provided.

Fuel Stops / Service

Fuel will not be available on route or at service areas and service crews should be instructed to carry sufficient for their vehicles. A designated service stop will be provided. With the exception of refuelling at commercial fuel pumps, servicing will not be permitted except at the designated service stop. All transits are to be considered quiet zones and any servicing in a quiet zone will be considered to be a serious violation of the quiet zone regulations.

Type

The rally is a performance rally consisting of special stages and transits. The total length of the event will be approximately 190 km including approximately 150 km of special stages. Road surfaces will be dirt and rock.

Area

The area covered will be entirely within the province of British Columbia, bounded by 50N and 51N latitude, and 121W and 122W longitude. The route is covered by topographic map 92 I/NW which is available from Maps-BC, Surveys and Resource Mapping Branch, Ministry of Environment, Lands and Parks, Parliament Buildings, Victoria, BC. Photocopies of maps for the areas required will be provided in the route book and service crew instructions.

Entries

The maximum number of entries will be limited to 30 cars in the order of receipt of entries. The organisers reserve the right to refuse any entry. Entries will be accepted until 21:00 on Friday June 15, 2001, or by prior arrangement with the registrar, until 8:00 on Saturday June 16, 2001.

Entry Fees

The standard entry fee will be \$300.00 Canadian funds (or \$200 US Funds) . The late entry fee, for entries received after June 6, 2001 will be \$350 (\$235 US Funds).

The entry fee must accompany the completed entry form or it will not be accepted. All entries accepted after June 6,2001 shall be assessed the late penalty.

A fine of \$25, payable at registration, will be assessed any CARS licensed competitor not providing proof of a currently valid Emergency or Basic First Aid training, or better.

All cheques and money orders are payable to WCRA and shall be post-dated no later than June 6,2001.

Refunds

As per CARS GCR 4.9, any refund will be mailed to the competitor following the rally.

Awards

Trophies – 1st Overall, 1st Novice and 1st in each vehicle class, as defined for the Western Canada Rally Championship: Production Over (P4 & N4 combined), Production Under (P1-3 and N1-3 combined), Group 2 and Open.

(A Novice driver is defined as one who starts a rally season having completed five or fewer regional, divisional or national performance rallies as a first driver, and has not finished first or second in a previous regional novice championship.)

Other awards, if available, will be posted at registration.

The Nokian Tires Contingency Award Program

The Nokian Tire contingency award program covers all BC regional performance and TSD events for the year 2001.

Eligibility: to participate in this program, cars must carry one Nokian decal on either side of the car (available at registration) and completely cover or remove any decals of other tire sponsors.

- The overall event winner will receive 2 Nokian tires (in a size of the winner's choice)
- First in class will receive 1 Nokian tire (in a size of the winner's choice)
- Second in class will receive a voucher for 50% off the purchase of a Nokian tire (this is not redeemable in cash)
- For the purposes of this contingency program, if there are less than 3 entries in any class, classes may be combined at the discretion of the organizers

Merchandise awards, to include T shirts, hats, etc, will be posted at registration.

Miscellaneous

Odo Check: An odometer check will be provided at registration.

Judges of fact During the running of the 2001 Mountain Trials Rally, the marshals will be declared to be “Judges of Fact” for compliance with the rules within control zones, stages and quiet zones.

This is a formal invitation to you to volunteer to work this event. If you have experience in marshaling, working controls, in scoring--- if you have an amateur radio license, you are the most desirable of volunteers. If you have no experience in working an event, you are very nearly as desirable a volunteer in that we will provide an orientation to teach you the skills and knowledge that you will need to do start/finish, timing, etc. The most important qualities that you will bring to the job include enthusiasm for rallysport, endurance, patience, a well-developed sense of humour, an ability to play well with others, and the knowledge that the event is only possible because of your involvement. You might also like to bring bug spray, food, a folding chair, water, toilet paper, a good book, sunglasses and sun screen (or conversely, an umbrella and rain gear).

Last year, Mountain Trials was the first performance rally organized by the West Coast Rally Association (WCRA) in some years; it signaled the beginning, again, of performance rallying on the mainland of BC. Based on the experience of running both Mountain Trials and Pacific Forest Rally last year, this year's events should continue the growth of the sport, and the progress towards hosting a round of the national championship next year, including the top national teams and coverage on TSN.

This year's Mountain Trials is a longer and more challenging event than last year: there are 156 kms of special stages and a 110 kms of transit stages for a total of 266 km run over almost 10 hours. The schedule has yet to be finalized, but it may include night stages and a spectator venue with opportunities for volunteers and spectators to take rides in the rally cars.

Should you wish to accept this invitation, and I hope that you will, please contact me to let me know what you might prefer to do. There will be 15 stages, plus 2 MTCs so controls will be moving during this event. We will need more workers than for Mt. Trials. Thanks ahead of time for your consideration.
